

## Greater Fort Wayne Inc. Leaders' Luncheon: Expanding CDFI Capacity in Allen County

## **Purpose**

To address the regional designation of Allen County as a CDFI desert and catalyze new capital partnerships that expand access to financial resources for underserved individuals and entrepreneurs.

- Explore opportunities for collaboration between CDFIs, banks, government, and philanthropy
- Mobilize leaders toward joint action and sustainable economic inclusion

  Development Fund and other CDFIs.
- A post-event survey will guide future action.
- Leaders are invited to invest in loan loss reserves, participate in co-lending, refer clients, and explore CRA-aligned partnerships.
